Georgetown University in Qatar prepares students for a variety of careers in international service by providing a four year liberal arts education focused upon the multidisciplinary study of international affairs. Completion of the multidisciplinary core curriculum in the first two years of study prepares students for entry into one of four majors offered: International Economics (IECO), International Politics (IPOL), Culture & Politics (CULP) and International History (IHST). Students declare a major in the fall semester of their second year, then usually pursue coursework for the major in the third and fourth years of studies.

CULTURE & POLITICS

The Culture & Politics major (CULP) seeks to interrogate complex issues relating to culture, politics, and power. This interdisciplinary study is both versatile and robust. It provides students with the theoretical tools and analytical skills that enhance cross-cultural tolerance, ethical leadership, and engagement with social justice issues.

INTERNATIONAL HISTORY

The International History major (IHIS) combines an introduction to the study of historical changes that transcend national boundaries with the opportunity to explore a particular theme or question in the context of a self-designed major concentration. In addition, the major exposes students to a range of theoretical tools and methodological approaches to historical analysis, and places special emphasis on the development of critical thinking, argumentation, and writing skills.

INTERNATIONAL ECONOMICS

The International Economics major (IECO) prepares students in developing the technical and analytical frameworks needed to analyze data and to understand how markets work. Among the topics covered are optimal resources allocation, labor markets, growth, and development. Economics is relevant for graduate studies or professional work in many fields due to its rigorous curriculum and the analytical and statistical tools it provides.

INTERNATIONAL POLITICS

The International Politics major (IPOL) allows students to specialize in the study of politics from the local to the global level. It builds on GU-Q's signature core curriculum which includes courses in Comparative Political Systems and International Relations. The major also offers students courses related to their regional interests and specialized subjects. The aim is to build a greater understanding of what shapes politics and policies and the intersection of governments, international institutions, and non-state actors.
